# 📕 Book Nook 📕

#### Notes from Mrs. M & the Library!

#### What we are learning!

**PK 4:** We talked about why we need rules. Good manners are following the rules. I read the book <u>Mind Your Manners at School.</u>

**PK 3:** I read the book <u>In the Middle of Fall</u> to them.

**Kindergarten**: We talked about who characters are in a book. We also talked about who the main character is in the book. I read the story <u>Pig the Slob.</u>

**First Grade:** We talked about how fiction and non fiction is different. They also sorted fiction and non fiction books.

**Second Grade:** They reviewed the call number, what is on top and what is on the bottom. They were given a work sheet where they had to add the bottom of the call number.

**Third Grade**: We looked at their answers and looked to see what was similar for each section. Then they did another sheet about finding if the bottom part of the call number was any other place on the book.

**Fourth Grade:** They were given a sheet to search out the shelves. They needed to find different things using library clues.

**Fifth/ Sixth Grade:** They took notes on the figurative language that I introduced them to. They wrote meanings of the different types. We took a closer look at meta-phors and similes.
