

Notes from Mrs. M & the Library! What we are learning!

PK 4: We started with book care. We talked about how books want to be treated. I read the book <u>When Monsters Check Out Books</u>.

PK 3: These kiddos will start having library on Sept. 18th

Kindergarten: They will review book care. We will discuss what is good for books and bad for books. I read the book <u>Do Not Bring your Dragon to the Library</u>. They will check out books.

First Grade: I told them the rules of being in the library. They reviewed book care. They took a tour of the library looking for clues and where they could take books out. They learned what a shelf marker is and how to use it.

Second Grade: They began with book care and library rules review. They also toured the library looking for clues that would help them to find books that they can read.
