#### What we are learning!

PK 4: I read the book There was an old lady who swallowed <u>a bat.</u> We talked about how this story is made up. This called fiction.

PK 3: I read the book There was an old lady who swallowed a bat. We talked a little bit about this being make believe or made up.

Kindergarten: I read the book The Good, the bad and the Spooky We reviewed the character and setting part of the story together.

First Grade: They continued to work on alphabetizing. We reviewed how the alphabet never changes. They did another worksheet with words that had the same first letter.

Second Grade: They started an escape room together. This escape room goes with picking just the right book. They listened to the story and then we worked together to fill in the blank. The second challenge was done today. They put it on their answer sheet.


Third Grade: They will worked on their book report and some of them worked on finishing up their nonfiction discovery


Fourth Grade: They worked on their book report and some of them worked on finishing up their task cards.
