What we are learning 4/17/24!

PreK 4: I read the story by Wendi Silvano <u>Turkey's Eggcellent Easter</u>. This story is an example of a author writing to entertain us.

PreK 3: I read Cordroy's Easter to them. This was flip book.

Kindergarten: We are continuing learning and reviewing the Author Jan Brett. I read the story The Easter Egg. This is a story about some bunnies who tried to make the best easter egg. Then we did a sequence picture of the story and then drew pictures of the story sequence.

First Grade: We continued with call numbers and played a game called Call Number Delivery.

Second Grade: We had finished the bat research but they needed to write a complete sentences so we worked on writing complete sentences.

Third Grade: They worked with finding words in the dictionary and then writing the two guide words next to the word they looked up.

Fourth Grade: They finished answering the questions I had given them that they needed to find using an atlas.
